- Consume less. Reuse. By in bulk. Avoid packaging. Don't buy "single use" items
- Reduce food waste, ensure that food scraps get composted
- Participate in, or start, a composting program in your city or town
- Learn more about Chicago's first residential composting program & find a nearby garden!

- Support small businesses working to minimize waste, source local, and provide local benefits
- Learn where your garbage goes and if it's polluting the environment. EPA'S Environmental Justice Screening And Mapping Tool epa.gov/ejscreen
- Support Earthbound's Nzambi Matee & Gjenge Makers turning plastic into building bricks
- Be a customer rather than a consumer. Aim to buy products that have or could have a second or third life. Ask yourself: what will happen to this product when I no longer have a need for it?
- Use REUSABLE bottles, bags, straws, utensils, etc.
- Be a leader: build a network, create content, join a board, run for office
- Contact your legislators with a letter or group letter & VOTE for candidates with strong environmental platforms
- Ask your legislators to support legislation banning foam foodware and plastic carryout bags. In Illinois: ilenviro.org/a/plastic-foam-ban
- In IL, join the IEC May 15 Zero Waste Lobby Day
- Draw down carbon through bioplastics, recycling, and coastal wetland protection
